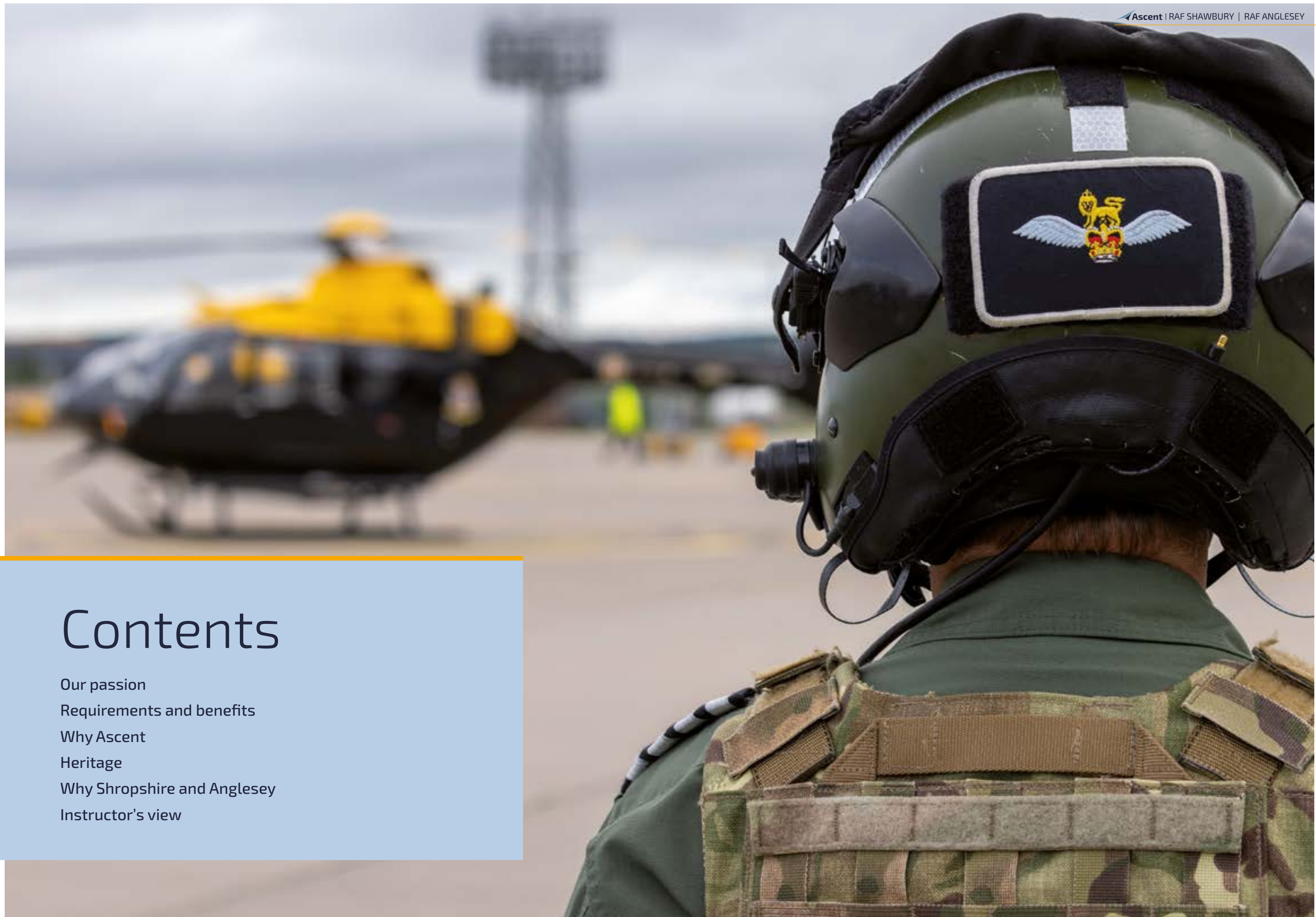

Pilots are taught the necessary handling and mission-management skills required to conduct winching operations resulting in the safe, effective recovery of personnel from cliffs, boats or small life rafts.

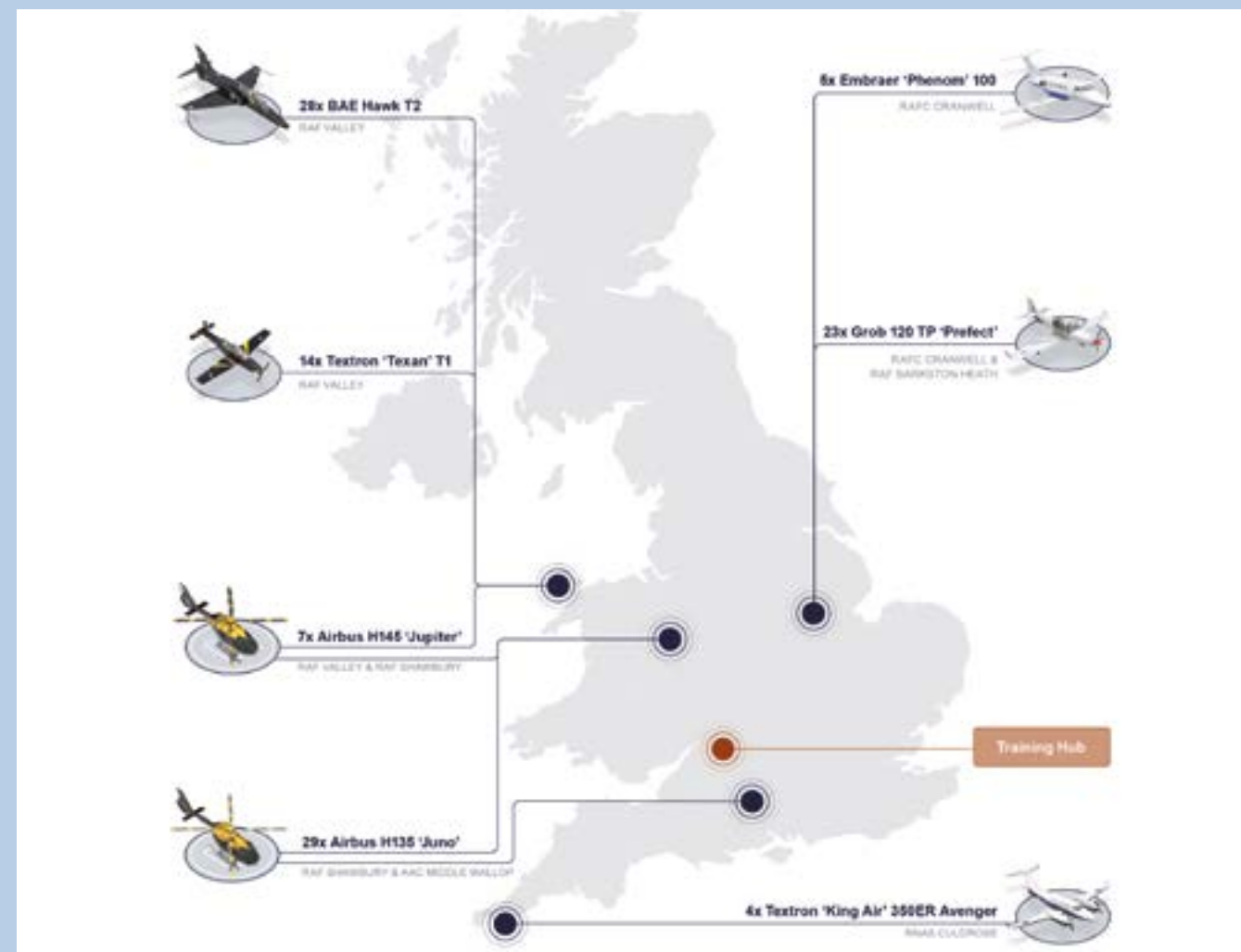

Heritage

RAF Shawbury provides world-class training to the UK Armed Forces and international partners.

No.1 Flying Training School (1FTS) trains helicopter aircrew. The Central Flying School (Helicopter) delivers Qualified Helicopter Instructors. The Defence College of Air and Space Operations trains Air Traffic Controllers, Weapons Controllers, Identification Officers and Flight Operations personnel.

As part of Rotary Flying Training, you will work collaboratively with one of five Squadrons:

660 Squadron AAC - A squadron of the British Army's Army Air Corps (AAC), it was formerly No. 660 Squadron RAF, an RAF air observation post squadron associated with the 21st Army Group during WW2. Since 1969, it has operated as a British Army unit, flying various types of battlefield helicopters. It forms part of 1FTS

705 Naval Air Squadron - The Squadron was formed in 1936 and operated Swordfish torpedo bombers from battlecruisers. It achieved squadron status in 1939 before being disbanded in 1940. The squadron was re-formed briefly in 1945 and then again in 1947 as a fleet requirements unit. Since the 1950s, the squadron has been involved in the basic training of helicopter aircrew, and is part of 1FTS.

60 Squadron - The Squadron was formed in 1916 and is part of 1FTS, flying the Airbus H135 Juno and H145 Jupiter.

670 Squadron AAC - A squadron of the British Army's Army Air Corps. It is responsible for the Operational Conversion Phase of the Army Pilots' Course. It was formerly No. 670 Squadron RAF.

202 Squadron - Based at RAF Valley, on Anglesey, 202 Sqn delivers the maritime and winching operations elements of the 1FTS syllabus. Formed initially in World War 1, 202 Sqn operated a number of fixed wing types before commencing Search and Rescue helicopter operations with Whirlwinds in 1964. 202 Squadron now operates the Jupiter H145.

Ascent is very proud to work with these squadrons - which have rich and unique histories - and we aim to maintain their high standards.



Why Anglesey?

Location

Following 20 years as a military helicopter pilot, the transition to civilian life with Ascent could not have been easier. Having previously served as an instructor at RAF Shawbury, returning to the fold to work alongside several familiar faces, as well as many new ones, felt both welcoming and engaging.

In my five-year absence from Shawbury, whilst flying overseas, the world-class infrastructure and setup change with the new UKMFTS footprint was extremely impressive and exciting to be a part of. Eight, state-of-the-art flight-sim training devices, capable of providing real-time conjoined formation missions, was not only a huge leap forward technologically, but also in terms of the training potential that could be offered to trainees. Those, coupled with virtual reality training devices for rear crew and advanced cockpit training simulators, were a monumental step forward from the archaic days of learning checks from cardboard cut-outs.

Flying the modern, glass-cockpit Airbus H135 'Juno' and H145 'Jupiter' aircraft has been thoroughly enjoyable and the capabilities they provide are often better than some front line aircraft. From a pilot's point of view, the cutting-edge helicopters are intuitive to fly and provide the perfect platform to instruct a multitude of profiles from. Flying one to two instructional sorties a day to help develop our nation's future military aviators is truly inspirational and thoroughly rewarding each time I step into the cockpit. Every day, every flight, and every trainee, brings a fresh new challenge which keeps the flying both varied and immensely satisfying.

Ascent is an excellent company to work for, with benefits ranging from private healthcare, electric vehicle and cycle-to-work schemes, as well as discount offers for most major shopping outlets. As a father, who regularly has to conduct

school runs, the working day and management are very accommodating with flexible working options for those that need the added domestic versatility.
